Zeb Stocken has many years experience of teaching and hosting bridge events, and whether you come as a group, in a pair or on your own, you can be certain of an instructive and enjoyable game.

Claudia – Zeb's sister – will be on hand to ensure the smooth running of your

holiday and, as a keen and experienced bridge player herself, she will also be supervising bridge sessions.

The bridge programme will be a mixture of teaching, supervised play and some duplicate – all played in a fun and friendly environment.



We will be playing bridge in the conservatory, on the ground floor with doors leading directly on to the landscaped gardens, providing a peaceful and



secluded setting. The tuition sessions will use CompassCards (set deals) and a fun topic tailored to the group.

This year we have added an extra bridge session on Friday afternoon if you are able to arrive a little earlier. This will be either duplicate or supervised play depending on the group.

During bridge play, there will be tea and coffee breaks to include home-made biscuits, water and cordials. All bridge sessions are optional and open to all standards of play.

Other things to do around and about

There will be an option of supervised bridge on Saturday afternoon, though you may prefer to explore the local surroundings.

The Cotwolds are famous for fine landscapes, gently undulating hills, picturesque villages with mellow buff stone cottages and an abundance of rivers and streams. There are some great local walks (maps available at the hotel) or you may prefer to travel further afield.

Here are a few ideas of places to visit and things to do:

Tetbury: A delightful market town, also houses Prince Charles' Highgrove shop (8 miles).

Nailsworth: A fair-trade Cotswold town lying in one of the Stroud Valleys (12 miles).



Cheltenham: England's most complete Regency town (25 miles).



Westonbirt Arboretum (left): One of the most spectacular tree collections in the world (10 miles).

Cotswold Water Park: 150 lakes set in 40 square miles of countryside (8 miles).

Bath: Designated a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, Bath is a unique experience,

with stunning architecture, great shopping and iconic attractions (28 miles).

Fine Dining

You can't fail to enjoy Peter Fairclough's modern British menu of fresh, seasonal produce. The breakfasts are an absolute treat as well, with a huge choice from the buffet and a range of delicious hot breakfasts made to order.



Here are some examples of dinner menus:

Fried duck egg, Duck Rillette, Leek and Bacon Puree, Girolles Crab cannelloni, Saffron sauce, wilted Spinach Salad of poached Autumn Pear and Roquefort, Caramelized Walnuts

Seared Sea Bass, crushed potatoes, Mussel Veloute Goats Cheese Polenta Cake, Wilted Spinach, Roasted Root Vegetables Pan fried Venison, swede and carrot dauphinoise, blackberry jus

Vanilla and tarragon panna cotta, poached plums Dark chocolate truffle terrine, Honeycomb Ice Cream Ginger and Saffron Crème Brûlée, Gingerbread Ice Cream

Dinner will be accompanied by half a bottle of house wine per person.



Lunch on Saturday and Sunday is not included, but we highly recommend The Potting Shed (left) which is just across the road and is the sister pub to the Rectory.

From sandwiches to their à la carte menu, the locally-sourced, seasonal food

is absolutely delicious, served in a fun and convivial atmosphere.

The pub was voted 'National Dining Pub of the Year' 2011 by the Good Pub Guide and has had very good reviews (booking required). Alternatively we can organise a lunch at The Rectory (approx £13.50 for 2 courses).

Accommodation

The 12 bedrooms at The Rectory are all individually designed and feature an eclectic mix of antique finds, updated with more contemporary pieces. All rooms come with Roberts retro radios, iPod docking stations, television and organic Bamford products. The six rooms below are on the first floor:



Laverton (£439 pp, double + shower) A light and airy double-aspect room overlooking the front lawn.



Nimlet (£449 pp, double + bath) This room enjoys side views of the garden from the window seat.



Cleeve (£479 pp, king/twin + bath) A lovely light room with window seats which have views to the side of the hotel.



Sudeley (£499 pp, double + bath)
This newly decorated room overlooks the Victorian Baptism pool at the rear.



Pennsylvania (£499 pp, king/twin + bath) This is a large light room overlooking the lawns at the front of the hotel.



Leckhampton (£509 pp, king + bath) A bright airy room with window seats and lovely views. Plus separate shower.

Together with hand sprung mattresses, fine Egyptian linens, bathrobes, deep baths and power showers, you can be sure of a relaxing stay. All rooms have en-suite bathroom facilities. The six rooms below are on the second floor:



Nibley (£419 pp, double + bath) Small but cosy, this room has original beams and a view of the village church.



Cam Peak (£439 pp, double + bath) Overlooking the croquet lawn, this room has lovely views over the front garden.



Nympsfield (£439 pp, king/twin + shower) This room is light and bright with views over the front and side gardens.



Belas Knap (£469 pp, king/twin + bath) This comfortable and cosy room has original beams.



Randwick (£469 pp, king/twin +bath) Original beams give this cosy room plenty of character.



Crickley (£479 pp, king/twin +bath) Double aspect windows make this room light and bright with views of the village.
